- We are proud cofounders of the Iowa Women in Trades Network, uniting over 70 Iowa tradeswomen.





FY24 Short-Term Grants and Projects

Current Grants	FY24 Award
Iowa City ARPA (QPP)	\$100K
OSHA Harwood	\$159K
LIFT (with CWJ)	\$40K
Hubbell Environmental Law	\$35K
CIRCA (QPP – Mitchellville)	\$20K
BlueGreen Alliance	\$50K
Total	\$404K (-F&A and expenses)

Fundraising Goal: \$130K

Our largest-ever fundraising initiative! Our goals is to hire one additional labor educator to meet rising statewide demand for classes. Outreach to:
